## Additional Requirements

- Coats Dual Duty XP ${ }^{\circledR}$ All-purpose thread in colors to match fabrics
- $79^{\prime \prime} \times 91^{\prime \prime}(200.66 \mathrm{~cm} \times 231.14 \mathrm{~cm})$ batting
- Sewing machine
- Rotary cutter/mat/ruler
- Basic sewing and pressing supplies

## Cutting

WOF=width of fabric; LOF=length of fabric

## Fabric A, cut:

(1) $241 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 361^{\prime \prime}(62.23 \mathrm{~cm} \times 92.71 \mathrm{~cm})$ from the upper left hand corner of the fabric length for quilt center (the $241 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ $(62.23 \mathrm{~cm})$ dimension is WOF and the $361 / 2^{\prime \prime}(92.71 \mathrm{~cm}$ dimension is LOF); from the remaining fabric, cut (6) $2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ $\times$ LOF ( $6.35 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ LOF), for binding

## Fabric B, cut:

(4) 7 " $\times$ WOF ( $17.78 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF);
sub-cut (2) $7^{\prime \prime} \times 361 / 2^{\prime \prime}(17.78 \mathrm{~cm} \times 92.71 \mathrm{~cm})$ and
(2) $7^{\prime \prime} \times 371 \frac{1}{2}{ }^{\prime \prime}(17.78 \mathrm{~cm} \times 95.25 \mathrm{~cm})$, for Border 1
(7) $7^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $17.78 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF), for Border 4

## Fabric C, cut:

(5) $4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $10.16 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF), for Border 2

## Fabric D, cut:

(6) $4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $10.16 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF), for Border 3

## Fabric E, cut:

(8) $4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $10.16 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF), for Border 5

## Sewing

## Notes:

- Use a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}(.64 \mathrm{~cm})$ seam allowance throughout. Sew all pieces with right sides together and raw edges using matching thread.
- When piecing border strips, sew end to end, matching adjacent stripes for a continuous look.


## Border 2

1. Remove the selvages and sew the (5) $4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $10.16 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF) Fabric $\mathbf{C}$ strips together along the 4" ( 10.16 cm ) edges to form one continuous strip. Press the seam allowances open. Cut (2) $4^{\prime \prime} \times 491 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ( $10.16 \mathrm{~cm} \times 125.73 \mathrm{~cm}$ ) and (2) $4^{\prime \prime} \times 44^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$ ( $10.16 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ $113.03 \mathrm{~cm})$ for Border 2.

## Border 3

2. Repeat Step 1 to sew the (6) $4^{\prime \prime} \times \operatorname{WOF}(10.16 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF) Fabric D strips together. Cut (2) $4^{\prime \prime} \times 561 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ $(10.16 \mathrm{~cm} \times 143.51 \mathrm{~cm})$ and (2) $4^{\prime \prime} \times 511 / 2^{\prime \prime}(10.16 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ 130.81 cm ) for Border 3.

## Border 4

3. Repeat Step 1 to sew the (7) $7^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF $(17.78 \mathrm{~cm}$ $\times$ WOF) Fabric B strips together along the 7" $(17.78 \mathrm{~cm})$ edges. Cut (2) 7 " $\times 631 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}(17.78 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ $161.29 \mathrm{~cm})$ and (2) 7 " $\times 641 / 2 "(17.78 \mathrm{~cm} \times 163.83 \mathrm{~cm})$ for Border 4.

## Border 5

4. Repeat Step 1 to sew the (8) $4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $10.16 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ WOF1) Fabric E strips together. Cut (2) $4^{\prime \prime} \times 761 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ( $10.16 \mathrm{~cm} \times 194.31 \mathrm{~cm}$ ) and (2) $4^{\prime \prime} \times 71^{112} 2^{\prime \prime}(10.16 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ 181.61 cm ) for Border 5.

## Quilt Assembly

Note: Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt.
5. Sew (1) $7^{\prime \prime} \times 361^{1 / 2}$ " $(17.78 \mathrm{~cm} \times 92.71 \mathrm{~cm})$

Fabric B Border 1 strip to each side of the $241 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ $361 / 2^{\prime \prime}(62.23 \mathrm{~cm} \times 92.71 \mathrm{~cm})$ Fabric A quilt center. Press the seams allowances toward the borders.
6. Sew (1) $7^{\prime \prime} \times 371 / 2^{\prime \prime}(17.78 \mathrm{~cm} \times 95.3 \mathrm{~cm})$ Fabric B Border 1 strip to the top and the other to the bottom of the quilt center.
7. Repeat Steps 5 and 6 to sew the (2) $4^{\prime \prime} \times 491 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ $(10.16 \mathrm{~cm} \times 125.73 \mathrm{~cm})$ Fabric C Border 2 strips to the sides of the quilt center and then the (2) $4^{\prime \prime} \times 441 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ( $10.16 \mathrm{~cm} \times 113.03 \mathrm{~cm}$ ) Fabric C Border 2 strips to the top and bottom of the quilt center.
8. Continuing this sequence, sew the (2) $4^{\prime \prime} \times 56 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ $(10.16 \mathrm{~cm} \times 143.51 \mathrm{~cm})$ Fabric $\mathbf{D}$ strips to the quilt center sides and then the (2) $4^{\prime \prime} \times 51 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}(10.16 \mathrm{~cm}$ $\times 130.81 \mathrm{~cm})$ Fabric $\mathbf{D}$ strips to the top and bottom to complete Border 3. Then sew the (2) 7 " $\times 631 \frac{1}{2}{ }^{\prime \prime}$ $(17.78 \mathrm{~cm} \times 161.29 \mathrm{~cm})$ Fabric $\mathbf{B}$ strips to the sides and (2) $7^{\prime \prime} \times 641 / 2^{\prime \prime}(17.78 \mathrm{~cm} \times 163.83 \mathrm{~cm})$ Fabric B strips to the top and bottom to complete Border 4. Finally, sew the (2) $4^{\prime \prime} \times 761 / 2^{\prime \prime}(10.16 \mathrm{~cm} \times 194.31 \mathrm{~cm})$
Fabric E strips to the sides and the (2) $4^{\prime \prime} \times 71 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ $(10.16 \mathrm{~cm} \times 181.61 \mathrm{~cm})$ Fabric $\mathbf{E}$ strips to the top and bottom to complete Border 5.

## Finishing

9. Layer the backing, batting, and quilt top. Baste and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the quilt top.
10. Sew the (8) $2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF ( $6.35 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ LOF) Fabric $\mathbf{A}$ strips together end to end using diagonal seams to make one continuous binding strip. Press seams open. Press the strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together.
11. Leaving an $8^{\prime \prime}(20.32 \mathrm{~cm})$ tail of binding, sew the binding to the top of the quilt through all layers with raw edges matching. Miter corners. Stop approximately $12^{\prime \prime}(30.48 \mathrm{~cm})$ from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along the quilt edge. Where the loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding right sides together. Trim seam to $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ $(.64 \mathrm{~cm})$ and press open. Finish sewing binding to the quilt.
12. Turn binding to back of quilt and hand-stitch in place.
